Group Strategic Report for the Year Ended 31 December 2019

The directors present their strategic report of the company and the group for the year ended 31 December 2019.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The Company's main activities are in four principal areas, the supply of office furniture, stationery printing and the supply/servicing of photocopiers

In 2019 we once again increased our Furniture Sales, whilst maintaining our overall sales at the previous years level. Our fixed costs and profit margins were both within budget.

Furniture sales continued to grow, both in terms of sales and gross profit. We continued in 2019 to expand our geographical sales area of furniture. We see this geographic diversification as an important part of our strategic push further in furniture sales. We maintained all our existing contracts and relationships and have established new ones, throughout the year.

During the fourth quarter of 2019 we established our 'own ranges' of furniture, both desking and seating with the strategic view of increasing our profit margins on these product lines. We believe in 2020 these own brand products will become established and enable us to operate far more independently of our manufacturer partners.

Stationery continued to maintain sales and profit despite a declining market. We anticipate in 2020, that we will move aggressively towards more online sales, with a reduced emphasis on sales staff. This will enable us to reduce fixed costs and improve profitability.

Print sales and copiers continue to have reduced sales, due to declining market demand. The Directors had anticipated these declines. And had reduced costs within these areas to reflect this.

The company remains profitable, and is confident that 2020 will prove to be a successful year in terms of growth and profitability.

We anticipate appointing a new director Adam Mills during 2020. This appointment will provide more youth and enthusiasm to the board into the next decade.

Group Strategic Report for the Year Ended 31 December 2019

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

In 2020 we have no major contracts due for renewal; but will be bidding for several new large furniture contracts.

The major risk of uncertainty in 2020 continues to be the effect on our supply chain due to Brexit. As the UK Government has still not come to an agreement with the E.U., we still operate under the threat of a 'no deal Brexit' and the effect this could have on our supply chain and costs of products.

We have excessive discussion regularly with our suppliers (who are all UK based) regarding their plans to ensure continued supply after December 2020.

We continue to expand our geographical area of sales - so as to ensure we are not dependent upon any one geographical area.

Our move to more 'online electronic ordering' for stationery will ensure its continued profitability whilst satisfying customer demand for more electronic ordering. Our risk here is to make this move from physical to electronic sales in an orderly/controlled manner.

The Directors continue to plan and operate the company in a manner which takes account of all the uncertainties and risks we have identified.

The Directors continue to be confident and optimistic about the long term future of the company.

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

H.Jenkinson & Company, Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in Not specified/Other. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the General Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of property.

Basis of consolidation

The Consolidated profit and loss account and balance sheet include the financial statements of the company and its subsidiary undertakings made up to the 31 December 2018. Intra-group sales and profits are eliminated fully on consolidation.

Significant judgements and estimates

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future event that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

There are not considered to be any critical judgements in applying the company's accounting policies.

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

Intangible assets

Intangible assets are initially measured at cost. After initial recognition, intangible assets are measured at cost less any accumulated amortisation and any accumulated impairment losses.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life or, if held under a finance lease, over the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

Freehold property

2% on cost

Fixtures and fittings

33% on cost, 20% on cost, 15% on reducing balance and 10% on reducing

balance

Motor vehicles

33% on cost

The freehold property was revalued in 2013. The depreciation of 2% is provided on the revalued amount annually.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet. Those held under hire purchase contracts are depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Those held under finance leases are depreciated over their estimated useful lives or the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

The interest element of these obligations is charged to profit or loss over the relevant period. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability.

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to profit or loss on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
