Gwasg Gregynog Limited Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objects of the charity are to promote for the benefit of the public and for the furtherance of education:

- i. the preservation and maintenance of Gwasg Gregynog
- ii. the printing, binding and production of fine private press books of literary, artistic or historical interest by traditional letter-press methods in addition to using materials of high quality.
- iii. an educational service to the University of Wales Trinity St David, schools, colleges and other interested parties by giving lectures on the history and work of Gwasg Gregynog and giving guided tours of the press. iv. the promotion of a wider understanding and appreciation of all aspects of the craft and art of book printing and binding by holding permanent and temporary exhibitions of fine books produced by Gwasg Gregynog and the printing techniques used to produce the books.
- v. the preservation and encouragement of the knowledge and traditional skills of letterpress, bookbinding and associated skills.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

This year a number of factors have affected the achievement and performance of Gwasg Gregynog Ltd.

In July 2019, the long awaited transfer of Gregynog Hall and Estate from the University of Wales to a new independent Gregynog Charitable Trust took place. The University of Wales had merged with Trinity St David, whilst the former constituent Colleges of the University of Wales are now independent universities in their own right.

In the new configuration, Gwasg Gregynog remains an independent company, limited by guarantee and managed by a Board of Directors and Trustees. The University of Wales Trinity St David exercises the powers of governance previously held by the University of Wales in the Company's Memorandum of Articles and Association.

Despite these changes, our erstwhile Controller Mr Dafydd Vickers made excellent progress on the pre-print preparation of the memorial volume for the late Dr Glyn Tegai Hughes. Unfortunately in 2019 Mr Vickers was diagnosed with a serious illness and most regrettably passed away in early January 2020. As the principal, highly specialist printer, and latterly Controller of the Press, Dafydd had a unique set of skills that ensured the high reputation of Gwasg Gregynog since its re-establishment in the late 1960s. His drive and commitment, furthered by his exacting standards, were legion and will be irreplaceable. Dafydd was also a global ambassador for Gwasg Gregynog, engaging with many visitors to the Hall, addressing specialist groups and conferences at home and abroad.

Currently therefore the future publication programme of Gwasg Gregynog is uncertain. However plans are well advanced for a further bibliography of the works of the press, entitled 'a descriptive catalogue of printing at Gregynog 1990-2008'. The bulk of this work has been undertaken by Mr Anthony Dowd, a retired Trustee, and for which we are most grateful. This new volume would be the companion to 'Gwasg Gregynog a descriptive catalogue of printing at Gregynog 1970-1990'.

On completion there would thus be a complete bibliography of the works of Gwasg Gregynog from 1970 to 2019 and as such, taken together, a finite catalogue of fine press publications to complement the body of works of its prestigious forerunner, the original Gregynog Press founded by the Davies sisters in the 1930s.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The principal sources of funding are from the sale of books and prints, donations from charities and other organisations, gift-aided and other donations from individuals and gifts in kind.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Investment policy and objectives

Under the Memorandum and Articles of Association the Company has the power to make any investment which the Trustees see fit.

Reserves policy

The Trustees have set a reserves policy that the minimum reserve shall be the average of three months operating costs. In consideration of reserves the Trustees have established a policy whereby unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible or fixed assets (i.e. free reserves) held by the charity should be sufficient to maintain the operation of the charity.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT Governing document

Gwasg Gregynog is a company limited by guarantee which was incorporated on 28th June 1978. It adopted new Memorandum and Articles of Association on 28th August 2001 and was granted charitable status by the Charity Commission on 11th January 2002.

Recruitment and appointment of new Trustees

Trustees are appointed in accordance with the Articles of Association by the University of Wales Trinity St David, which has power to remove and appoint additional Trustees as it considers fit.

Organisational structure

The Trustees meet as necessary on an ad hoc basis. The Executive Group, consisting of two Directors, together with the Staff, meet to take current decisions, subject to later ratification by the Board.

Induction and training of new Trustees

The familiarisation of new Trustees with the charity and the context within which it works takes the form of a full understanding of:-

- i. The obligations of Trustees.
- ii. The operational framework of the charity, particularly in relation to the Memorandum and Articles.
- iii. Resourcing of the charity's activities and the current financial position.
- iv. The future planning and objectives.

Related parties

The University of Wales Trinity St David is a related party, as described in the Memorandum and Articles of Association.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006 relating to small companies.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery - 25% on reducing balance

Computer equipment - 25% on cost

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the Trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
