STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

The directors are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulation.

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have prepared the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards, comprising FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" Section 1A, and applicable law). Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing the financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- state whether applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards, comprising FRS 102 Section 1A, have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006.

DIRECTORS' CONFIRMATIONS

In the case of each director in office at the date the Directors' Report is approved:

- so far as the director is aware, there is no relevant audit information of which the company's auditors are unaware; and
- they have taken all the steps that they ought to have taken as a director in order to make themselves aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the company's auditors are aware of that information.

GOING CONCERN

The company has net current liabilities as at the Balance Sheet date, which primarily relates to a loan made from Jiayi International Education Investment Group Limited (the parent company) to Bambinos Limited to facilitate the purchase of two properties. The directors of the related company have indicated that they will not demand repayment within 12 months from the date of signing the accounts; however, no formal loan agreement is in place. The directors have also considered the future developments of the company and are confident that the company will continue to remain profitable, based on recent financial results. On this basis, the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements, which assumes the company will continue in operation for the foreseeable future.

COVID-19

Following lockdown beginning at the end of March 2020, sales for April and May were very low due to the COVID-19 impact with no centres opening during this period, although 15% of usual monthly fees were still charged as a retainer for clients. Figures for June have returned to a more acceptable level although still down on previous years and lower than expected for this time of the year.

During the pandemic, a number of staff were furloughed and this has been beneficial for Bambinos since the outbreak lockdown began in March 2020. Bambinos were able to claim 65% for the month of March and April and 61% for months thereafter. In line with government instruction, Bambinos had to make up each furloughed employee's pay to 80%, but with charging parents 15% of usual fees and the retention of the grant income from the government, we have been sufficient. The majority of furloughed staff have now returned to work.

COVID-19 (continued)

Bambinos applied for, and received, a £50,000 'bounce back' loan during the lockdown, which has been placed in the reserve account to utilise if and when required. The loan is interest free for 12 months before the repayment period begins.

At present the current and reserve accounts are healthy and are expected to be sufficient for the relatively quiet period in Autumn where such reserves are usually required.

Should a second wave appear, resulting in Plymouth having to go into a local lockdown, all advice and instructions given will be adopted and similar protocols followed as per the first wave. Local news and government guidelines will be monitored closely. Each site operates under vigorous and robust risk assessments that are reviewed frequently in line with changing advice.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS

The independent auditors, PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP, will be proposed for re-appointment at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting.

Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

In our opinion, Bambinos Limited's financial statements:

Notes to the Financial Statements For The Period 1 January 2019 to 31 August 2019

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Bambinos Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis, under the historical cost convention. The preparation of financial statements in conformity with FRS102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the company's accounting policies.

The current reporting period is 8 months in order to be in line with the parent reporting period of the 31st August.

Goina concern

The company has net current liabilities as at the Balance sheet date, which primarily relates to a loan made from Jiayi International Education Investment Group Limited (the parent company) to Bambinos Limited to facilitate the purchase of two properties. The directors of the related company have indicated that they will not demand repayment of the loan within 12 months from signing the accounts; however, no formal loan agreement is in place. The directors have also considered the future developments of the company and are confident that the company will continue to remain profitable, based on recent financial results. On this basis, the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements, which assumes the company will continue in operation for the foreseeable future.

Turnover

Turnover represents the value of services provided under contracts to the extent that there is a right to consideration and is recorded at the value of the consideration due.

Goodwill

Goodwill, being the amount paid in connection with the acquisition of a business in 1999, is being amortised evenly over its estimated useful life of twenty years.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Land and buildings - 2% on cost and 4% on cost

Plant and machinery - 33% on reducing balance, 25% on reducing balance and 10% on reducing balance

Taxation

Taxation for the period comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Statement of Income and Retained Earnings, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the period end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to profit or loss in the period to which they relate.

3. EMPLOYEES AND DIRECTORS

The average number of employees during the period was 76 (2018 - 75).

4. AUDITORS' REMUNERATION

All audit fees in respect of the company are paid for by the parent company, Jiayi International Education Investment Group Limited.

5. PRIOR YEAR ADJUSTMENT

INTANGIRI E ASSETS

At 31 December 2018

A prior year adjustment has been recognised in the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2018 in respect of depreciation that had not been charged on the freehold properties. This treatment is not in accordance with FRS 102 which states that property should be depreciated.

The effect on retained earnings brought forward at 1 January 2018 is a reduction of £139,500. The financial results for each of the years ended 31 December 2009 to 31 December 2017 were overstated by £15,500.

13. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

Rent is paid to Mr W Lane and Mrs A Lane (who were directors during the year ended 31 December 2018) totalling £Nil (2018: 22,500) for use of two properties.

Consultancy fees of £8,000 (2018: £9,000) were paid to Mr W lane and Mrs A Lane during the period.

During the year ended 31 December 2018, the company purchased two properties from Mr W Lane and Mrs A Lane for £1,575,000. All transactions were made on commercial terms and at an arms' length basis.

A loan existed between the company and Jiayi International Education Investment Group Limited, the parent company. At the year end the company owed Jiayi International Education Investment Group Limited £2,285,139 (2018 £2,235,139). This loan is interest free and payable on demand.

14. CONTROL

The ultimate parent company is Jiangsu Jiayi Education Technology Limited, a company incorporated in China.
