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STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Praise Chapel is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association and controlled by a Board of Trustees who are directors for the purpose of company law and trustees for the purposes of charity law.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

New Trustees are selected on the basis of the contribution they will make to the governance of the organisation and the skills they will contribute. They are provided with copies of the Charity Commission's guidance to trustees and given an introduction to the activities of the charity by the existing board members.

Principal Activity

The principal activity of the company under review was the advancement of the Christian religion.

Risk management

The trustees have addressed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those relating to specific operational areas of the charity and its finances. The trustees believe that by monitoring reserve levels, by ensuring controls exist over key financial systems and by examining the operational and business risks faced by the charity, they have established effective systems to mitigate those risks.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The charity has one main objective:

· The advancement of the Christian religion worldwide

It pursues this objective by operating a centre for Christian worship at Sidings Community Centre, 150 Brassey Road, Kilburn, London, its current offices at The Mill House, Columbia Avenue, Edgware and through a programme of events aimed at reaching out to the unchurched together with a range of community-centred projects.

The charity's strategies for achieving this objective are:

Kidz Club

Once a month children from the local area are invited to a 'Saturday Club'. Our minibuses transport the children from the local community. The club activities include fun-filled games, music as well as object and themed life lessons.

Senior Citizens

Our Senior Citizens Outreach Team meet residents at a local sheltered housing scheme. They have a friendly chat, studying the Bible, share testimonies and sing praise and worship songs. The Bible is shared in a clear and concise manner to encourage residents to embrace a practical application of faith and to live beyond the confinement of their years enabling them to deal with challenges and situations they may be faced with. At Christmas we also gave Christmas Hampers to over 350 senior citizens in the local area which were gratefully received.

Family Development Centre

The Family Development Centre offers a confidential Christian Counselling Service available to all regardless of gender, sexual orientation, ethnic or cultural background, to people of any faith, or none.

Counsellors work with an integrated approach to counselling which seeks to help any individual achieve their full potential by resolving a variety of issues. However, we respect a person's right to their own beliefs. We work with a team of professionally trained counsellors who work within a code of ethics.

We have clients from Praise Chapel as well as referrals from other churches, GP practices in Edgware and Harrow and clients from the local community.

We began developing group work and preventative counselling workshops. This year we have noticed a significant increase in people seeking counselling.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Events

In addition to our regular Sunday and Midweek services we also held various outreach events throughout the year to promote the Christian faith and be of service to the local community. These included:

- · Good Friday Concert
- Ladies Meetings
- · Family Conference
- · Youth Outreach Concert
- · Choice Men's Advance (residential weekend)
- · Senior Citizen's Lunch
- · Christmas Eve & New Year's Eve Services

Missions

The charity continues to provide financial support to overseas charities in India, Uganda, Cameroon, Ghana, Nicaragua and Europe through our Missions Programme.

We were also involved in Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child Shoebox project again over the Christmas Season. Members of the congregation prepared gift boxes to bring hope and smiles to some of the world's poorest children.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery	- 20% on reducing balance
Fixtures and fittings	- 20% on reducing balance
Motor vehicles	- 20% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
