For the year ended 31 December 2013

The Directors present their annual report on the affairs of the Company, together with the financial statements and auditor's report for the year ended 31 December 2013. The company is exempt from presenting a strategic report based on its classification as small as per the Companies Act 2006.

Principal activities and business review

The Company holds the legal title to a portfolio of properties rented to companies within the Balfour Beatty Group.

Results

The results for the year are set out in the profit and loss account on page 6. The loss after taxation for the year ended 31 December 2013 was a loss of £45,000 (2012: £6,000).

No dividend payment was proposed by the Directors or paid during the year (2012: nil).

The Directors consider that the year-end financial position was satisfactory and that the company is well placed to develop its activities in the foreseeable future.

Financial instruments

The Company's activities do not expose it to price risk, liquidity risk or cash flow risk. The Company's financial assets are amounts owed by Balfour Beatty Group undertakings, for which the credit risk is limited. The Company has not used financial instruments to change its exposure to any of the above risks.

Going Concern

Having made appropriate enquiries, the Directors consider it reasonable to assume that the Company has adequate resources to continue for the foreseeable future and, for this reason, have continued to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

Statement of Directors' responsibilities

The Directors are responsible for preparing the annual report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Notes to the accounts

1. Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice. This policy has been applied consistently throughout the year, and the preceding year. The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as discussed in the Directors' Report on page 2.

In accordance with the provisions of Financial Reporting Standard 1 "Cash Flow Statements", the Company has not prepared a cash flow statement because its ultimate parent undertaking, Balfour Beatty plc, prepares consolidated financial statements which include the Company and are publicly available.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation, net of depreciation and provision for impairment.

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation, less estimated residual value, of each asset on a straight-line basis over its expected useful life, as follows:

Leasehold land and buildings

Lower of 40 years and lease term

Taxation

Current tax, including UK corporation tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the Company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.

A net deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis.

Turnover

Turnover represents rental income from properties rented by the company and is recognised on accrual basis in the UK in the normal course of business, excluding VAT.

Going Concern

The Company's ability to continue as a going concern is assessed in conjunction with the ultimate parent, Balfour Beatty plc, as its liability is dependent upon the ability of the Group companies to settle their intercompany balances with the company.

The directors are satisfied that after appropriate consultation with the directors of Balfour Beatty plc, the Group is able to operate for the foreseeable future. For this reason the Company continues to adopt the going concern basis.
