Going concern

The Company has confirmation of continued financial support from the ultimate parent undertaking. Based on the directors' latest forecasts, the directors have used the going concern basis to prepare the financial statements, as they expect the Company to meet its liabilities as they fall due for a period of not less than 12 months from the date of signature of these financial statements.

Post balance sheet events

On 7 February 2019 it was announced that the Company's US holding company, SMG Inc, and AEG Facilities, the venue management subsidiary of AEG, a leading global sports and live entertainment company, have signed a definitive agreement to merge. SMG's ultimate parent undertaking, Onex Corporation, is contributing its entire equity investment in SMG into the merger.

This combination will create a new, standalone global facility management and venue services company that will operate as ASM Global ("ASM"). Onex and AEG's subsidiary will each own 50% of the company following the completion of the transaction. The transaction has received global regulatory approval and is expected to be completed in early October 2019, subject to customary closing conditions.

If this transaction takes place as planned it will result in a change in the ultimate ownership of the Group in which the Company is a member. However, it is not expected to have any direct impact on the Company's affairs and operations and has had no effect on the results of the Company in the year ending 31 December 2018.

There were no other significant events affecting the Company since the year end.

REPORT ON THE AUDIT OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Opinion

In our opinion, Newcastle Tyne Theatre Limited's financial statements:

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

1. General information

Newcastle Tyne Theatre Limited is a private company limited by shares and incorporated in England. Its registered office is Manchester Arena, Victoria Station, Hunts Bank, Manchester M3 1AR.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Section 1A of Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgment in applying the Company's accounting policies (see note 3).

2.2 Small companies exemptions

The directors have taken advantage of the small companies exemption provided by section 414B of the Companies Act 2006 in not preparing a Strategic Report and have also taken advantage of certain exemptions when preparing the Directors' Report.

2.3 Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.5 Taxation

Tax is recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income, except that a charge attributable to an item of income and expense recognised as other comprehensive income or to an item recognised directly in equity is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date in the countries where the Company operates and generates income.

2.6 Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.7 Provisions for liabilities including bank loans and overdrafts

Provisions are made where an event has taken place that gives the Company a legal or constructive obligation that probably requires settlement by a transfer of economic benefit, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

Provisions are charged as an expense to the Statement of Comprehensive Income in the year that the Company becomes aware of the obligation, and are measured at the best estimate at the Statement of Financial Position date of the expenditure required to settle the obligation, taking into account relevant risks and uncertainties.

When payments are eventually made, they are charged to the provision carried in the Statement of Financial Position.

3. Judgments in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The Directors considered that there are no significant judgements applied within the financial statements.
