REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2022

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2022. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### **Objectives and Aims**

The charity's objectives and its principal activity is to promote the education and development of children in the County Borough of Conwy by lending resources to Registered Early Years settings. The summary of the main achievements below gives details of the activities carried out in furtherance of the charities' objectives.

#### **Current Service Delivery**

The Conwy Early Years Forum Toy Library is a mobile service (term time only) for member establishments throughout the county. Toys are loaned on a half termly basis, following a rota of visits agreed with the member settings. Members may also arrange to come to the office to borrow and return items between scheduled visits.

A catalogue of resources is regularly updated and can be provided to members as a hard copy, on a disk, or it can be e-mailed as a PDF file to assist members to choose items for their next visit. Requirement can also be discussed with the Toy Librarian and items may be reserved for a future visit.

#### **ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE**

#### Charitable activities

This year has been a difficult year due to Covid 19. The Toy Library had 55 members at the end of March 2022. During this reporting period we were not able to provide our service due to Covid 19 and the subsequent lockdown for the first seven months. Our coordinator was furloughed for this period. We were able to access our premises from October 18th 2021 and we started visits to settings to loan out toys on November 15th 2021. We have not received membership subscriptions as settings had paid for a service which we were unable to deliver over the last financial year, but we have received financial help from the Government furlough scheme towards paying the coordinator's wages.

The Toy Library supports voluntary childcare sector in the main, but private childcare settings and foundation phase nursery provision in schools can become members ensuring universal benefit for children across the County Borough of Conwy.

#### **Objectives and Aims**

Going forward our aim is to continue with the high standard of service provided to early years settings. Future plans are focused on obtaining funding and developing the service for the benefit of all members.

During the year (April 2021 to March 2022) it was decided, in discussion with our local CVC, Community and Voluntary Support Conwy (CVSC), to pursue the option of changing the governance of the organisation to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO). Due to Covid, this has been delayed, but we should be in a position to action this in the next few months. At the end of 2019 we were successful in a bid to Comic Relief for funds to support an extension of the organisation's work to other areas in the locale, to support further research, to purchase further materials and to develop support materials for people working with children. A good start was made on this project but unfortunately Covid meant that many of the early years' settings closed, and our coordinator was furloughed. However, since the resumption of our service in October we have restarted our work towards fulfilling our project commitments in agreement with the funder.

#### **Quality Assurance**

We continually strive to deliver a high standard of service, placing increasing emphasis on responding to feedback from our service users.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

#### **Reserves Policy**

Any surplus funds are retained in the current account. The reserve funds will be used for replacing equipment and resources and when necessary with the consent of the Trustees.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Governing document

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee, and is therefore governed by its memorandum of articles and association.

#### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

All members are invited to put themselves forward for nomination onto the management committee at the AGM. Currently serving committee members and staff are happy to spend time discussing the work of the forum with any prospective volunteer.

#### **Staffing and Accommodation**

Our main office is based within education services in the Old School Lane Integrated Centre, Church Walks, Llandudno.

Conwy Early Years Forum Toy Library employs one member of staff on a part time basis of 22 hours per week, school term time only.

#### **Training**

The co-ordinator attends relevant training courses during the year in order to enhance professional development and update health and safety knowledge.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2022

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005) issued in March 2005, applicable UK Accounting Standards and the Companies Act 1985. The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of financial statements are set out below.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Toys & Books - 25% on reducing balance
Fixtures and fittings - 25% on reducing balance
Motor vehicles - 25% on reducing balance
Computer equipment - 25% on reducing balance

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
