NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 30 NOVEMBER 2013

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Finance lease agreements

Where the company enters into a lease, which entails taking substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of an asset, the lease is treated as a finance lease. The asset is recorded in the balance sheet as a tangible fixed asset and is depreciated in accordance with the above depreciation policies. Future instalments under such leases, net of finance charges, are included with creditors. Rentals payable are apportioned between the finance element, which is charged to the Profit and Loss Account on a straight-line basis, and the capital element, which reduces the outstanding obligation for future instalments.

Where the company has entered into a sale and leaseback agreements, the finance leases are matched by secured deposits such that interest earned on the deposits will cover the interest charge on the finance leases over the term of the lease. The deposits are only to be used to settle the finance lease liabilities and therefore it has been offset with the finance lease creditor to show the net unmatched liability at the year end. Similarly, the interest earned on the deposits is offset against the interest charges within the lease payments.

Financial instruments

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the entity after deducting all of its financial liabilities.

Where the contractual obligations of financial instruments (including share capital) are equivalent to a similar debt instrument, those financial instruments are classed as financial liabilities. Financial liabilities are presented as such in the balance sheet. Finance costs and gains or losses relating to financial liabilities are included in the profit and loss account. Finance costs are calculated so as to produce a constant rate of return on the outstanding liability.

Where the contractual terms of share capital do not have any terms meeting the definition of a financial liability then this is classed as an equity instrument. Dividends and distributions relating to equity instruments are debited direct to equity.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided on the film asset in accordance with the cost recovery method whereby depreciation is taken to the profit and loss account on the same basis as the income received in the accounting period.
