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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2021

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 July 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objects of the Charity

The Charity's objects are for the benefit of the public generally in the Area of Benefit to:

- Provide activities and/or facilities that promote physical and mental health and social integration amongst members of the community.
- Provide and assist in providing health-improving activities for persons who have need by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, poverty or social and economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving their conditions of life.
- Help and educate people through sport, physical activity and volunteering and such other means as the Trustees think fit in accordance with charity law so as to develop their physical, mental and spiritual capacities that they may reach their potential and grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society.
- For the general purposes of such charitable bodies or for such other exclusively charitable purposes in each case as the trustees may from time to time decide.

Summary of the main activities undertaken in relation to these objects

Due to the impact of the COVID pandemic affecting the charity's operations there was limited activity during this year. The trustees did receive one grant application which was supported, a summary of this project is outlined in the achievement and performance section below.

In agreement with Sport England the Active Ageing project was closed as a result of the ongoing impact of the COVID pandemic. At this point we await confirmation from Sport England for final account reconciliation.

Public benefit

The Trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on their legal duty on public benefit and are satisfied that the charity delivers public benefit. Due regard is also paid to the guidance on public benefit when deciding which new projects to undertake.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2021

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Grant Awarded

Organisation: TEAMS and Bensham Community Care

Project: Re-engaging with the community following the centre closure due to Covid restrictions

Amount Awarded: £923.20

Period of Award: October 2020-April 2021

The organisation aims to prevent and alleviate the ill effects of isolation and loneliness for vulnerable older people who experience age related illness, bereavement, poor well-being and/or mental health, memory loss and/or disability. At the centre they come together for group activities and also a lunch club. Meals are also delivered in the community.

The challenge was to encourage members to re-engage after a lengthy period of isolation since the start of the pandemic.

The trustees agreed that the award be used towards creating a safe space for attendees, volunteers and staff. This was within the centre and also out in the community.

The award was used to purchase PPE also perspex screens for the dining area to enable more members to safely attend the lunch club.

Since October 2020, over 4,000 meals in the community were delivered and 58 people have returned to the centre.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

During the year under review, the charity's total income was £15 (2020 - £55,414) and total expenditure was £25,782 (2020 - £1,713). At the balance sheet date, total funds amounted to £130,592 (2020 - £156,359) of which £6,392 (2020 - £25,204) was subject to restriction.

Reserves

The charity has no buildings or employees so requires a relatively low level of reserves, as such no specific amounts have been set aside.

FUTURE PLANS

- Reconnect with existing partnerships and establish new ones;
- Appoint a minimum of 1 new trustee;
- Raise the profile of REACH NE;
- Increase the number of local organisations benefiting from Reach NE support.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2021

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Reach North East Ltd is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It was originally incorporated as the Sport Northumbria Foundation on 11 February 2004 and registered as a charity with the Charity Commission on 13 October 2005. The name of the company was changed to the Northumbria Sport Foundation by special resolution on 29 February 2012 and subsequently changed to Reach North East Ltd by special resolution on 21 August 2019. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association, which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and it is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

As of October 2019 the articles of association for the charity were changed by special resolution, this included a change to the objects for the charity as outlined under Objectives and Activities.

Appointment of trustees

New trustees are appointed by the existing trustees and serve for 4 years after which they must be put forward for reappointment.

Organisational structure and decision making

At the quarterly trustees' meetings the trustees agree the broad strategy, examine and assess current processes and agree areas of activity including grant applications and award decisions.

All trustees have equal voting rights for decision making. In addition, the trustees are actively involved in the operational running of the charity.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The presentation currency of the financial statements is the Pound Sterling (£).

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis. At the date of signing of the financial statements there were no material uncertainties regarding the charity's ability to continue for the foreseeable future.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Debtors

Trade and other debtors (including prepayments) are recognised at the settlement amount due or amount prepaid net of any trade discounts.

Creditors are recognised at their settlement amount nett of any trade discounts.

Financial instruments
