OPINION

Appropriate audit procedures in response to these risks were carried out. These procedures included:

- Discussions with management, including consideration of known or suspected instances of non-compliance with laws and regulation and fraud;
- Reading minutes of meetings of those charged with governance;
- Obtaining and reading correspondence from legal and regulatory bodies including HMRC;
- Identifying and testing journal entries;
- Challenging assumptions and judgements made by management in their significant accounting estimates.

We also communicated relevant identified laws and regulations and potential fraud risks to all engagement team members; and remained alert to any indications of fraud or non-compliance with laws and regulations throughout the audit.

There are inherent limitations in the audit procedures described above and the further removed non-compliance with laws and regulations is from the events and transactions reflected in the financial statements, the less likely we would become aware of it. Also, the risk of not detecting a material misstatement due to fraud is higher than the risk of not detecting one resulting from error, as fraud may involve deliberate concealment by, for example, forgery or intentional misrepresentations, or through collusion.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

BBH-LSL Bid Cost Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered and domiciled in the UK (England and Wales). The financial statements have been prepared under the historical costs convention and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland and Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements are presented in pounds sterling which is the company's functional currency and rounded to the nearest pound. The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgement in applying the company's accounting policies. No significant judgements or estimates have been used in the preparation of these financial statements.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

1.2 GOING CONCERN

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis which assumes the company will be able to continue in operation for the foreseeable future.

1.3 COMPANY DISCLOSURE EXEMPTIONS

In preparing the financial statements of the company, advantage has been taken of the following disclosure exemption available in FRS102, as a result of the company being a small entity:

- No cash flow statement has been presented for the company.

2. AUDITOR'S REMUNERATION

Auditor's remuneration is borne by Building Better Health - Lambeth Southwark Lewisham Limited, the parent company.

3. EMPLOYEES

The Company has no employees other than the directors, who did not receive any remuneration (2021 - £NIL).

4. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

6. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The company has taken advantage of the exemption provided in FRS102 not to disclose transactions with companies within the group of which it is a member, where these transactions occur between entities which are 100% owned members of that group.

7. CONTROLLING PARTY

The company is a 100% subsidiary of BBH-LSL Bid Cost Holdco Limited, a company incorporated in England and Wales.

The parent entity of BBH-LSL Bid Cost Holdco Limited is Building Better Health - Lambeth Southwark Lewisham Limited incorporated in England and Wales. As the group qualifies as small, no consolidated financial statements are prepared for the group of which the Company is a member.

The company is ultimately 60% owned by Meridiam Infrastructure Finance s.a.r.l., a company based in Luxembourg. However as a result of the shareholders' agreement of Building Better Health - Lambeth Southwark Lewisham Limited there is no effective control by any individual shareholder.
