REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The business environment was again challenging in 2019 but the director is pleased to report that revenues have been maintained at a similar level to the previous year, with margins showing a slight improvement.

The company's key financial and other performance indicators during the year were as follows:

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The continuance of the business is dependent on the ongoing support of the finance providers, ABN AMRO, via the invoice discounting arrangement in place. However, there are no indications that this support will not continue for the foreseeable future.

DEVELOPMENT AND PERFORMANCE OF THE BUSINESS

The core business has continued to develop well in the year. The covid virus continues to create uncertainty in the business community and also remains a corporate risk.

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

The key performance indicators of the business remain revenue generated and gross margin achieved. These are set out above.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of provision of on-site managed services.

DIVIDENDS

No dividends will be distributed for the year ended 31 December 2019.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

It is expected that the core business will continue at a similar level and the director hopes that profitability will return, due to restraint of costs and improved margins, and further investments in technology.

DIRECTOR

J N Wolfe held office during the whole of the period from 1 January 2019 to the date of this report.

FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

Objectives and policies

The company has an agreement with ABN AMRO whereby the latter purchases the debts and advances a percentage of their value in advance of monies received. This provides funding for the business as required.

Price risk, credit risk, liquidity risk and cash flow risk

The principal risks are as noted above. If the terms of the agreement are unacceptably breached, ABN AMRO would be entitled to terminate the agreement.

EMPLOYMENT OF DISABLED PERSONS

The company is pleased to offer employment to disabled people on the same terms as all other staff, in so far as they are able to perform the same duties.

EMPLOYMENT INVOLVEMENT

Employees are fully briefed about the work and ethos of the company at the start of their employment and are encouraged to participate in the positive image of the business in the performance of their duties and in their ongoing relations with management.

STATEMENT OF DIRECTOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The director is responsible for preparing the Strategic Report, the Report of the Director and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Notes to the Financial Statements

for the Year Ended 31 December 2019

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Solsbury Solutions Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Significant judgements and estimates

The following judgements (apart from those involving estimates) have been made in the process of applying the above accounting policies which have had the most significant effect on amounts recognised in the financial statements: Holiday pay accrual, included in other creditors, is calculated on the basis of the relevant percentage of salaries as reduced over the period to reflect the residual liability after estimated holidays taken or lapsed.

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of consideration received or receivable for services supplied, recognised principally based on timesheets, excluding Vat Added Tax, for services in tax weeks falling entirely or mostly within the calendar year under review.

Goodwill

Positive goodwill is capitalised, classified as an asset on the balance sheet and amortised on a straight line basis over its useful economic life. It is reviewed for impairment at the end of the first full financial year following the acquisition and in other periods if events or changes in circumstance indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Amortisation

Amortisation is provided on intangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows:

Asset class Amortisation method and rate

Goodwill Straight line over 5 years from 31 December 2015

Intangible assets

Intangible assets are initially measured at cost. After initial recognition, intangible assets are measured at cost less any accumulated amortisation and any accumulated impairment losses.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings - 25% on reducing balance Motor vehicles - 25% on reducing balance

Taxation

Taxation for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

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Notes to the Financial Statements - continued for the Year Ended 31 December 2019

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the year end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

Research and development

Expenditure on research and development is written off in the year in which it is incurred.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to profit or loss on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to profit or loss in the period to which they relate.

Going concern

Despite the losses in the current year, the financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis. The continuance of the business is dependent upon the ongoing support of finance providers, ABN AMRO via the invoice discounting arrangement in place. However, there are no indications that this support will not continue for the foreseeable future. The director has also given consideration to the possible effects of the ongoing Covid-19 outbreak which began after the year end and which has continued to affect the company. However, government assistance has facilitated cashflow and no adverse consequences have yet been felt. He has also considered the uncertain effects of the UK's departure from the EU and is confident that any difficulties can be resolved without ongoing detriment to the business.

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. The invoice discounting creditor is included at full value in creditors falling due within one year. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

Debtors and creditors receivable/payable within one year.

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate or payable within one year are recorded at transaction value. Losses arising from impairment are reognised in the profit and loss account.
