Opinion

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2020

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Portal Investment News Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PREPARING THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" including the provisions of Section 1A "Small Entities" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

TURNOVER

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

INTANGIBLE ASSETS

Intangible assets are initially measured at cost. After initial recognition, intangible assets are measured at cost less any accumulated amortisation and accumulate impairment losses.

TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery etc - 33% on cost

TAXATION

Taxation for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Income Statement, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

DEFERRED TAX

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the year end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

INVESTMENTS

Investments in shares are included at fair value.

11. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

Portafina LLP ('PFS'), Portal Claims LLP ('PC'), Hayward Marsh LLP (HM), Paramount Independent Property Services (PIPS), Astamor LLP (AS) and Portal Tax LLP (PT) are all Limited Liability Partnerships under the same control as the Company. Bulldog Property Partners (BP) is a partnership under the same control as the Company. Portafina Investment Management Ltd (PIM) is a Company under the same control as this Company.

At the year end the amount due from the related parties as follows: PC £55 (2019: £6,347), AS £13 (2019: £187), PIM £213,892 (2019: owed to £80,000) and PIPS £99,899 (2018: £93,099).

At the year end the amount due to the related parties as follows: PFS £354,604 (2019: £264,688 and, PT £14,042 (2019: £14,042).

The Companies in which T D Moore is a director, The Portal Network Ltd (PNL) and Ice Dragons Limited (IDL). At the year end the amount due from them as follows: PNL £90,038 (2019: £90,038) and IDL £3,013 (2019: £3,013).

Included in Other Debtors is an amount due from five Limited Companies, in which the individual directors have material interests. The amount outstanding at the year end, in total, was £67,218 (2018: £67,218).
