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INTRODUCTION

I am now in a position to close the liquidation and write to provide my final account and to put creditors on notice of my intention to seek release from office.

The purpose of this report is to detail the acts and dealings of the Liquidator and it should be read in conjunction with previous correspondence to Creditors.

ADMINISTRATION AND PLANNING

The Liquidator is required to meet a considerable number of statutory and regulatory obligations. Whilst many of these tasks do not have a direct benefit in enhancing realisations for the insolvent estate, they assist in the efficient and compliant progressing of the administration of the case, which ensures that work is carried out to high professional standards. A detailed list of these tasks are to be found in Appendix II.

ENQUIRES AND INVESTIGATIONS

During the Review Period, the Liquidator carried out an initial review of the Company's affairs in the period prior to appointment. This included seeking information and explanations from the director(s) by means of questionnaires; making enquiries of the Company's accountants; reviewing information received from creditors; and collecting and examining the Company's bank statements, accounts and other records.

The directors provided the books and records and a completed questionnaire.

The information gleaned from this process enabled the Liquidator to meet his statutory duty to submit a confidential report to the Insolvency Service on the conduct of the directors of the Company in the three years prior to the insolvency of the Company.

This work was also carried out with the objective of making an initial assessment of whether there were any matters that may lead to any recoveries for the benefit of creditors. This would typically

Include any potential claims which may be brought against parties either connected to or who have past dealings with the Company.

This initial assessment has been completed and the Liquidator did not identify any further assets or actions which might lead to a recovery for creditors.

REALISATION OF ASSETS

Assets

According to the statement of affairs lodged in these proceedings, the assets of the company had an estimated value of £6,520 which comprised solely of Cash at Bank. Detailed below is key information about asset realisation and strategy.

Cash at Bank

On the Statement of Affairs, it was estimated that a credit balance of £6,520 was being held in the company's bank account. Following my appointment, I formally asked the company's bankers to close the account and remit any credit balance. The sum of £9,382.76 was received from the company's account to the liquidation account.

Stock, Furniture and Equipment

On 22 October 2020, a valuation of the stock of the Company was prepared by G.J Wisdom & Co, an independent firm of Auctioneers & valuers who hold Professional Indemnity Insurance. The sum of £8,771.00 plus VAT was realised.

CREDITORS

The following sections explain the anticipated outcomes to creditors and any distributions paid.

Secured creditors

The Company has not granted any charges over its assets. Where a floating charge is created after 15 September 2003 a prescribed part of the company's net property shall be made available to unsecured creditors. The Company has not granted a floating charge to any creditor after 15 September 2003 and consequently there is no prescribed part in this Liquidation.

Preferential creditors

Employee claims

Employees' preferential claims as per the Statement of Affairs totalled £800. Claims were submitted and paid by the Redundancy Payment Office. I have not adjudicated on Employees' claims as there are no funds remaining in this matter for distribution.

Unsecured creditors

The unsecured creditors as per the statement of affairs totalled £122,981. Proofs of debt received total £130,866.67. I have not adjudicated on creditors' claims as there is no fund remaining in this matter.

FEES AND EXPENSES

Fixed fee agreed with the Directors and ratified by members and creditors.

The fee for assisting in respect of the instructions given to prepare a Statement of Affairs and to seek a decision from the creditors on the appointment of a Liquidator of £4,500 and disbursements plus VAT was paid from realisations and is shown in the enclosed receipts and payments account.

Liquidator's Remuneration

It is the firm's practice to ensure that work is conducted by the appropriate staff member at the appropriate level of experience. Junior members of staff deal with the day to day administration on cases and a manager and director then oversees the work undertaken. Where the issues are complex and litigious, the work will be closely supervised or undertaken by a manager or director.

The basis of the Liquidator's fees was approved by creditors on fixed fee basis and disbursements plus VAT in accordance with the following resolution:

That The liquidator be authorised to draw his remuneration on a fixed fee basis, as set out in the fees estimate dated 24 September 2020 totalling £11,000, with such remuneration to be drawn on account from time to time as funds permit.

I have drawn my remuneration in this matter.

Expenses

I have incurred total expenses in the Liquidation of £1,074.90.

This is made up as follows:

Agents and Valuers

G.J Wisdom & Co Auctioneers & valuers were instructed as agents and valuers in relation to the sale of the stock of the company. Their standard sales commission costs of £4,696.43 plus VAT have been agreed and paid in full.

CREDITORS' RIGHTS

An unsecured creditor may, with the permission of the court or with the concurrence of 5% in value of the unsecured creditors (including the creditor in question) request further details of the Liquidator's remuneration and expenses, within 21 days of receipt of this report. Any secured creditor may request the same details in the same time limit.

An unsecured creditor may, with the permission of the court or with the concurrence of 10% in value of the creditors (including the creditor in question), apply to court to challenge the amount and/or basis of the Liquidator's fees and the amount of any proposed expenses or expenses already incurred, within 8 weeks of receipt of this report. Any secured creditor may make a similar application to court within the same time limit.

EC REGULATIONS (WHETHER PROCEEDINGS ARE MAIN PROCEEDINGS OR TERRITORIAL)

The Company's centre of main interest was in the UK. Accordingly, these proceedings are main proceedings as defined in Article 3 of the EC Regulation.

Below is detailed information about the tasks undertaken by the Liquidator.

General Description	Includes
Administration and planning	<i>This represents the work that is involved in the routine administrative functions of the case by the office holder and his staff, together with the control and supervision of the work done on the case by the office holder and his managers. It does not give direct financial benefit to the creditors, but has to be undertaken by the office holder to meet their requirements under the insolvency legislation and the Statements of Insolvency Practice, which set out required practice that office holders must follow.</i>

RELEVANT EXTRACTS OF RULES 18.9 AND 18.34 OF THE INSOLVENCY (ENGLAND & WALES) RULES 2016

Rule 18.9

- (1) The following may make a written request to the office-holder for further information about remuneration or expenses set out in a final report under rule 18.14:
- a secured creditor;
 - an unsecured creditor with the concurrence of at least 5% in value of the unsecured creditors (including the creditor in question); or
 - any unsecured creditor with the permission of the court.
- (2) A request or an application to the court for permission by such a person or persons must be made or filed with the court (as applicable) within 21 days of receipt of the report by the person, or by the last of them in the case of an application by more than one creditor.

Rule 18.34

- (1) This rule applies to an application in a winding-up made by a person mentioned in paragraph (2) on the grounds that:
- the remuneration charged by the office-holder is in all the circumstances excessive;
 - the basis fixed for the office-holder's remuneration under rules 18.16, 18.18, 18.19, 18.20 and 18.21 (as applicable) is inappropriate; or
 - the expenses incurred by the office-holder are in all the circumstances excessive.
- (2) The following may make such an application for one or more of the orders set out in rule 18.36 or 18.37 as applicable:
- a secured creditor; or
 - an unsecured creditor with either
 - (i) the concurrence of at least 10% in value of the unsecured creditors (including that creditor), or
 - (ii) the permission of the court.
- (3) The application by a creditor must be made no later than eight weeks after receipt by the applicant of the final report or account under rule 18.14 which first reports the charging of the remuneration or the incurring of the expenses in question.
