The directors are satisfied with the performance of the business, considering the consequences of the Covid 19 pandemic. The company's turnover decreased by 35% compared to the previous year. The directors were able to manage the costs of the business such that part of the loss in turnover was off-set by cost savings.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Company is exposed to liquidity risk, credit risk and interest rate risk. However, there are no external borrowings of the company, and therefore the liquidity and interest rate risks are not considered material.

The Company's principal financial assets are cash and trade receivables. Therefore, the Company's credit risk is primarily attributable to its trade receivables. The Company's approach to managing the credit risk is to monitor these trade receivables and make an allowance for impairment when there is objective evidence that the Company will not be able to collect all amounts according to the general terms of the receivables concerned.

REGULATORY RISK

This is the risk of non-compliance with the regulatory environment the Company operates in. The Company monitors the regulatory environment closely. The Company also holds compliance meetings regularly to ensure the Company remains compliant with existing and upcoming regulatory changes. The Company promotes transparency and openness when working with regulatory parties. During the year there were a number of complaints made to the company in progress, the Company has been fully cooperative in respect of these matters and is working to resolve these issues.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 30 June 2021

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Gallium P E Depositary Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

The presentation currency of the financial statements is the Pound Sterling (£).

The principal activity of the company is to act as a private equity depositary and is authorised by the FCA.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PREPARING THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARD 102 - REDUCED DISCLOSURE EXEMPTIONS

This company is a qualifying entity for the purposes of FRS 102, being a member of a group where the parent of that group prepares publicly available consolidated financial statements, including this company, which are intended to give a true and fair view of the assets, liabilities, financial position and profit or loss of the group. The company has therefore taken advantage of exemptions from the following disclosure requirements:

- Section 33 'Related Parties' Presentation of related parties and disclosures;
- Section 7 'Statement of cash flows' Presentation of statemement of cash flow;

The financial statements of the company are consolidated in the financial statements of Gallium Funds Solutions Group Limited. These consolidated financial statements are available from its registered office, Gallium House. Unit 2 Station Court, Borough Green, Sevenoaks, Kent TN15 8AD.

TURNOVER

Turnover represents commission and fees receivable for depositary services net of VAT. Income is recognised as services are provided.

INTEREST INCOME

Interest income is recognised in the Statement of income and retained earnings using the effective interest method.

GOVERNMENT GRANTS

Government grants are recognised at the fair value of the asset received or receivable when there is reasonable assurance that the company will comply with conditions attaching to them and the grants will be received using the accrual model.

FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The company has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised in the company's balance sheet when the company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Basic financial assets

Basic financial assets, which include debtors and cash and bank balances, are initially measured attransaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

Other financial assets

Other financial assets, including investments in equity instruments which are not subsidiaries, associates or joint ventures, are initially measured at fair value, which is normally the transaction price. Such assets are subsequently carried at fair value and the changes in fair value are recognised in profit or loss, except that investments in equity instruments that are not publicly traded and whose fair values cannot be measured reliably are measured at cost less impairment.

Impairment of financial assets

Financial assets, other than those held at fair value through profit and loss, are assessed for indicators of impairment at each reporting end date.

Financial assets are impaired where there is objective evidence that, as a result of one or more events that occurred after the initial recognition of the financial asset, the estimated future cash flows have been affected. If an asset is impaired, the impairment loss is the difference between the carrying amount and the present value of the estimated cash flows discounted at the asset's original effective interest rate. The impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

If there is a decrease in the impairment loss arising from an event occurring after the impairment was recognised, the impairment is reversed. The reversal is such that the current carrying amount does not exceed what the carrying amount would have been, had the impairment not previously been recognised. The impairment reversal is recognised in profit or loss.

Derecognition of financial assets

Financial assets are derecognised only when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the asset expire or are settled, or when the company transfers the financial asset and substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership to another entity, or if some significant risks and rewards of ownership are retained but control of the asset has transferred to another party that is able to sell the asset in its entirety to an unrelated third party.

Other financial liabilities

Derivatives, including interest rate swaps and forward foreign exchange contracts, are not basic financial instruments. Derivatives are initially recognised at fair value on the date a derivative contract is entered into and are subsequently re-measured at their fair value. Changes in the fair value of derivatives are recognised in profit or loss in finance costs or finance income as appropriate, unless hedge accounting is applied and the hedge is a cash flow hedge.

Debt instruments that do not meet the conditions in FRS 102 paragraph 11.9 are subsequently measured at fair value through profit or loss. Debt instruments may be designated as being measured at fair value though profit or loss to eliminate or reduce an accounting mismatch or if the instruments are measured and their performance evaluated on a fair value basis in accordance with a documented risk management or investment strategy.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are derecognised when the company's contractual obligations expire or are discharged or

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued TAXATION

The tax expense represents the sum of the tax currently payable and deferred tax.

CURRENT TAX

The tax currently payable is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from net profit as reported in the profit and loss account because it excludes items of income or expense that are taxable or deductible in other years and it further excludes items that are never taxable or deductible. The company's liability for current tax is calculated using tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting end date.

DEFERRED TAX

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all material timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

TRADE RECEIVABLES

Trade and other receivables are initially recognised at fair value plus any directly attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition, they are measured at amortised cost less a provision for expected credit losses

PROVISIONS FOR LIABILITIES

Provisions are made where an event has taken place that gives the Company a legal or constructive obligation that probably requires settlement by a transfer of economic benefit, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

Provisions are charged as an expense to the Statement of income in the year that the Company becomes aware of the obligation, and are measured at the best estimate at the Balance sheet date of the expenditure required to settle the obligation, taking into account relevant risks and uncertainties.

When payments are eventually made, they are charged to the provision carried in the Balance sheet.

GOING CONCERN

The financial statements of the company have been prepared on a going concern basis. The company made a profit in the year of £15,525 (2020: £185,622), has net assets of £190,507 (2020: £185,622), has net assets of £190,507 (2020: £174,982) and has cash at bank and in hand of £127,108 (2020: £188,854).

At the time of approving the financial statements, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus, the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

The World Health Organisation declared the outbreak of a coronavirus (COVID-19) a pandemic. The COVID-19 outbreak in the United Kingdom has resulted in the temporary lockdown and reduction of operations which have been government mandated. The directors have reviewed and factored potential delays and reassess cash flow forecasts and budgets, which show that the company would have sufficient working capital for at least a year from the date these Financial Statements are approved. This is based on the assumptions that the budgeted forecasts are achievable, and governments continue to support industry. Given the above, the directors consider it appropriate to adopt a going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and cash equivalents are basic financial assets and include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

CREDITORS

Short term creditors are measured at transactions price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transactions costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

VALUATION OF INVESTMENTS

Unlisted investments represent units in alternative investment funds and are initially measured at the transaction price. Subsequently, the investments are measured at fair value with changes in fair value reflected in profit or loss.

3. CRITICAL ACCOUNTING JUDGEMENTS AND KEY SOURCES OF ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTY

In the application of the company's accounting policies, the director is required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The directors consider the company to be a going concern, for the reasons as detailed in Note 2 to these financial statements.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised where the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods where the revision affects both current and future periods.

4. TURNOVER

The turnover and profit (2020 - loss) before taxation are attributable to the one principal activity of the company.
