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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 May 2018

The trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 May 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102, effective 1 January 2015).

2017/18 was a year of transition for the foundation. It was with great sadness that we recorded in last year's report the death of Stephen Evans, who tragically passed away in September 2017. Steve was the driving force behind the charity, and his time and inspiration are a huge loss. Having been the lead Executive, responsible for the operational running of the Charity, his loss also caused significant upheaval and it has taken time for the trustees to regroup. However, we are pleased to report that we have continued some fundraising and welfare activities.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The primary objective of the charity is to inspire success by providing opportunities to promote sport and creative education for children and young people in the Pontefract area and wider West Yorkshire region.

Our Mission

Our mission is to encourage children and young people in the West Yorkshire region to be active and enrich their lives through new experiences.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The Pontefract Sports & Education Foundation ('the Foundation') has continued its work of providing support and opportunities to children and young people in the region.

On the fundraising side, the Charity Race day at Pontefract Races continues to be the main fundraising activity. Over £7,600 was raised on the day. Other income was mainly derived from charity dinners (£815) and donations.

On the Welfare side, the Foundation has now funded nearly 1,500 individual sessions for young people during its life, with a big uplift delivered over last year. The majority of this focus continues to be through the close partnership with Pontefract Squash Club, and specifically the senior coach, Malcolm Willstrop, together with Jayne Robinson, a partnership which has helped expand our work.

The long-standing relationship with Airedale Junior School has continued and the trustees were delighted that the Foundation's support of the school was recognised in their most recent OFSTED report. The Foundation also helped put in place a trip for a group of pupils to attend the British Open Squash Championship in Hull.

The Foundation has also worked closely with St Giles School. As well as squash provision, the Foundation funded a trip to the Wonkey Donkey Sanctuary in Knottingley and put in place performing arts workshops through a partnership with Wakefield Theatre Royal.

The Foundation once again supported the Pontefract Educational Trust's 'Celebration Day'. However, with the disbanding of that organisation, work has now begun to engage with its schools directly. With the lack of this central body, it is the Foundation's aim to take it upon itself to organise a similar event in 2018, such was the success of previous days.

A major development saw partnership with Rackets Cubed, a London-based charity that aims to enhance the long-term achievement of inner city kids through integrated Sports, Education and Nutrition programmes. Rackets Cubed have generously agreed to fund a long-term project with one of our local schools, with a programme currently being put together with Airedale School, to start in September 2018. The expectation is that this will be a pilot programme that could be replicated in the future.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The Charity retains sufficient cash reserves to meet its immediate obligations.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing instrument and is constituted as a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

The governing instrument under which the company operates is its Memorandum & Articles incorporated 24 May 2013 as amended by special resolution registered at Companies House on 9 January 2014.

The directors are treated as trustees for Charities Act purposes.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The trustees of the charity constitute directors of the company for the purposes of company law. This report is also the directors' report as required by Sections 415 to 418 of the Companies Act 2006.

New trustees are appointed by the existing trustees as and when a casual vacancy arises and are then formally appointed by the members in general meeting.

Decision making

Stephen Evans acted as lead Executive for the Charity until his death in September 2017. His role entailed the operational running of the Charity and organising the majority of the fundraising events. As remuneration for this, the Charity paid Simple Evolution Limited, a company owned and managed by Stephen Evans, £250 per month. He also received, through Simple Evolution Limited, 10% of any surplus generated from fundraising events he organised.

Since September 2017 the Charity has been managed solely by the trustees.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
