### LIQUIDATOR'S ACTIONS SINCE APPOINTMENT

All matters pertaining to the liquidation have now concluded, with no further investigations required and no assets available for realisation.

There is certain work that I am required by the insolvency legislation to undertake in connection with the liquidation that provides no financial benefit for the creditors. A description of the routine work undertaken since my last progress report is contained in Appendix 1.

### RECEIPTS AND PAYMENTS ACCOUNT

My Receipts & Payments Account for the period from 21st April 2020 to 20th October 2022 is attached at Appendix 2.

The Receipts & Payments account is shown net of VAT.

The balance of funds was held in an interest-bearing estate bank account.

### **ASSET REALISATIONS**

No assets have been realised in this reporting period.

For details of assets realised in previous reporting periods, please refer to previous progress reports.

### LIABILITIES

### **Secured Creditors**

An examination of the Company's mortgage register held by the Registrar of Companies, showed that the Company has no current charges over its assets.

The legislation requires that if the Company has created a floating charge after 15 September 2003, a prescribed part of the Company's net property (i.e. the money that would otherwise be available to the charge holder) should be ring-fenced for distribution to unsecured creditors. In this case there were no creditors secured by a floating charge such that the prescribed part provisions do not apply.

### **Preferential Creditors**

The statement of affairs anticipated an uncertain amount in respect of preferential creditors. No claims have been received.

### **Crown Creditors**

The statement of affairs included £5,755.21 owed to HMRC. However, HMRC have not submitted a claim in the liquidation to the date.

### Non-Preferential Unsecured Creditors

The statement of affairs included 17 non-preferential unsecured creditors, including HMRC with an estimated total liability of £91,796.85. I have received claims from 5 creditors at a total of £85,574.43. I have not received claims from 12 creditors with original estimated claims in the statement of £20,319.87. The difference is due to Isle of Wight Council's claim being underestimated in the Statement of Affairs.

### **DIVIDEND PROSPECTS**

A dividend will not be declared to non-preferential unsecured creditors as the funds realised have been used to make payments to meet the expenses of the Liquidation.

### INVESTIGATION INTO THE AFFAIRS OF THE COMPANY

I undertook an initial investigation into the Company's affairs to establish whether there were any potential asset recoveries or conduct matters that justified further investigation, taking account of the public interest, potential recoveries, the funds likely to be available to fund an investigation, and the costs involved.

Specifically, I recovered, listed and reviewed the Company's accounting records; obtained and reviewed copy bank statements for the 24 months prior to the Company ceasing to trade from the Company's bankers; and compared the information in the Company's last set of accounts with that contained in the statement of affairs lodged in the Liquidation and made enquiries about the reasons for the changes.

There were no matters that justified further investigation in the circumstances of this appointment.

Within three months of my appointment as Liquidator, I am required to submit a confidential report to the Secretary of State to include any matters which have come to my attention during the course of my work which may indicate that the conduct of any past or present Director would make them unfit to be concerned with the management of the Company. I would confirm that my report has been submitted.

### PRE-APPOINTMENT REMUNERATION

The creditors previously authorised the payment of a fee of £4,000.00 + VAT for my assistance with preparing the statement of affairs and arranging the decision procedure for creditors to appoint a liquidator.

The fee for preparing the statement of affairs and arranging the decision procedure for creditors to appoint a liquidator was paid by White Property Limited, who is connected to the Company as the Director of White Property Limited is the son of deceased Director Mr Gerard White.

### LIQUIDATOR'S REMUNERATION

My remuneration was approved on a time cost basis based on a fees estimate of £22,010.00. The fees estimate acts as a cap and I cannot draw remuneration in excess of that estimate without first seeking approval from the creditors. My total time costs to 20th October 2022 amount to £14,053.00, representing 58.00 of hours work at a blended charge out rate of £242.29 per hour, of which £1,180.00, representing 4.00 of hours work, was charged in the period since 21st April 2022, at a blended charge out rate of £295.00 per hour. The actual blended charge out rate incurred compares with the estimated blended charge out rate of £275.13 in my fees estimate. There is a difference in the blended rate charged, compared with the estimated blended rate because more work was completed by lower graded staff.

I have drawn £691.67 to 20th October 2022 of which none was drawn in the period since 21st April 2022,

### LIQUIDATOR'S EXPENSES

Expenses are any payments from the estate which are neither an office holder's remuneration nor a distribution to a creditor or a member. Expenses also includes disbursements. Disbursements are payments which are first met by the office holder and then reimbursed to the office holder from the estate. Expenses are split into:

- category 1 expenses, which are payments to persons providing the service to which the expense relates who are not an associate of the office holder; and
- category 2 expenses, which are payments to associates or which have an element of shared costs. Before being paid category 2 expenses require approval in the same manner as an office holder's remuneration.

I have not recovered any expenses with an element of shared costs in this case.

I have incurred expenses of £15.56 in the period since 21st April 2022 not inclusive of VAT. In the whole of the Liquidation I have incurred total expenses of £332.51 not inclusive of VAT, compared to my estimated expenses of £386.33 when my remuneration was authorised by the creditors.

I have drawn £10.00 not inclusive of VAT to 20th October 2022 of which none was drawn in the period since 21st April 2022.

The choice of professionals used was based on my perception of their experience and ability to perform this type of work, the complexity and nature of the assignment and the basis of my fee arrangement with them. I have reviewed the fees charged and am satisfied that they are reasonable in the circumstances of this case.

Creditor Gateway provide a secure online hosting facility for reports to creditors.

Statutory advertising costs were incurred in placing advertisements relating to the Liquidator's appointment in the London Gazette.

The Specific Bond is required to be put in place to cover the value of assets in an estate in insolvency appointments to insure against any losses to the estate caused by fraud or dishonesty on the part of an Insolvency Practitioner.

The Software License Fee is a fixed fee paid for the use of a case management system.

As you can see above, the total expenses I incurred were in line with the total expenses I estimated I would incur when my remuneration was authorised by the creditors.

### **FURTHER INFORMATION**

An unsecured creditor may, with the permission of the Court, or with the concurrence of 5% in value of the unsecured creditors (including the creditor in question), request further details of the Liquidator's remuneration and expenses within 21 days of their receipt of this final account. Any secured creditor may request the same details in the same time limit.

An unsecured creditor may, with the permission of the Court, or with the concurrence of 10% in value of the unsecured creditors (including the creditor in question), apply to Court to challenge the amount of remuneration charged by the Liquidator as being excessive, and/or the basis of the Liquidators's remuneration, and/or the amount of the expenses incurred as being excessive, within 8 weeks of their receipt of this final account. Any secured creditor may make a similar application to court within the same time limit.

### Appendix 1

### 1. Administration

This represents the work involved in the routine administrative functions of the case by the office holder and their staff, together with the control and supervision of the work done on the case by the office holder (and their managers). It does not give direct financial benefit to the creditors, but has to be undertaken by the office holder to meet their requirements under the insolvency legislation and the Statements of Insolvency Practice, which set out required practice that office holders must follow.

- Undertaking regular bank reconciliations of the bank account containing estate funds.
- Reviewing the adequacy of the specific penalty bond on a quarterly basis.

- Overseeing and controlling the work done on the case by case administrators.
- Seeking closure clearance from HMRC and other relevant parties.
- Preparing, reviewing and issuing a final account of the liquidation to creditors and members.

### 2. Creditors

Claims of creditors - the office holder needed to maintain up to date records of the names and addresses of creditors, together with the amounts of their claims as part of the management of the case, and to ensure that notices and reports could be issued to the creditors. The office holder also needed to deal with correspondence and queries received from creditors regarding their claims and dividend prospects as they were received. The office holder was required to undertake this work as part of his statutory functions.

- Dealing with creditor correspondence, emails and telephone conversations regarding their claims.
- Maintaining up to date creditor information on the case management system.
- Paying tax deducted from the dividends paid to employees.
