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Strategic Report For the Year Ended 31 March 2021

Introduction

The directors present their strategic report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2021.

Principal activity

The company is a holding company for its direct subsidiary Evergreen Holdco 1 Limited.

Business review

The company indirectly owns 100% of the shares Sygnature Discovery Limited, a company engaged in collaborative integrated drug discovery services to the pharmaceutical and biotechnology market.

The company also indirectly owns 100% of the shares RenaSci Limited, a company involved in drug discovery and development.

The company measures its performance by the performance of its trading subsidiaries and a full review of these businesses including the impact of Covid-19 can be ascertained from a review of these companies' financial statements. The directors are satisfied with the performance of the investee companies during the year under review. Further details are provided in note 2.3 of the directors assessment of Covid-19 on the company.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The group's operations are managed according to policies and procedures approved by the board of directors. As a holding company the principal risks relate to the recovery of its investment. The risks associated with the trade of the indirect subsidiary are disclosed in that company's financial statements.

Liquidity risk

The company seeks to manage financial risk by ensuring sufficient liquidity is available to meet foreseeable needs assessed through careful monitoring of the long term cash requirements of the business and its subsidiaries. The objective is to ensure a mix of funding methods offering flexibility and costs effectiveness to match the needs of the company. The company has borrowings and its liquidity requirements are met from these cash resources.

Insolvency risk

The directors consider that there is an unrecognised value in investments above historical cost on balance sheet and as such the directors are satisfied that long term liabilities will be satisfied through realising investments at a point in the future.

Interest rate risk

The company finances its operations through bank loans, credit facilities provided by Group companies. Interest payable on bank loans is managed through the use of a cap and collar hedging instrument to minimise exposure to changes in interest rates. Interest rates on credit facilities provided by Group companies are at fixed rates and therefore not exposed to changes in interest rates.

The Directors continued to provide oversight governance of its subsidiaries to ensure that they comply with the Group's policies and maintain high standards of business conduct. The subsidiaries provide regular updates on their activities to the Directors in their role as director of the Company.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 31 March 2021

1. General information

Aghoco 1566 (Bidco) Limited is a private company limited by shares and incorporated in England and Wales under the Companies Act 2006. The address of the registered office is given on the company information page and the nature of the company's operations and its principal activities are set out in the strategic report.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgement in applying the company's accounting policies (see note 3).

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

2.2 Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by the FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland":

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows;
- the requirements of Section 3 Financial Statement Presentation paragraph 3.17(d);
- the requirements of Section 11 Financial Instruments paragraphs 11.42, 11.44 to 11.45, 11.47, 11.48(a)(iii), 11.48(a)(iv), 11.48(b) and 11.48(c);
- the requirements of Section 12 Other Financial Instruments paragraphs 12.26 to 12.27, 12.29(a), 12.29(b) and 12.29A;
- the requirements of Section 33 Related Party Disclosures paragraph 33.7.

This information is included in the consolidated financial statements of Aghoco 1579 (Topco) Limited as at 31 March 2021 and these financial statements may be obtained from Companies House, Crown Way, Maindy, Cardiff, CF13 3UZ.

2.3 Exemption from preparing consolidated financial statements

The company is a parent company that is also a subsidiary included in the consolidated financial statements of its ultimate parent company and is therefore exempt from the requirement to prepare consolidated financial statements under section 400 of the Companies Act 2006.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 31 March 2021

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.4 Going concern

As at 31 March 2021 the company has net current liabilities of £21,123,087 (2020: £17,442,888) and net liabilities of £11,295,890 (2020: £7,632,423). The company is an investment holding company and as such the assessment of going concern for the company is consistent with the investee companies in which it holds an investment and the wider group of which it is part.

The board have prepared Group forecasts and the directors are satisfied that the Group has headroom in its existing committed facilities to respond to the various realistic downside sensitivities in its forecasts. After consideration of these forecasts and making appropriate enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the Group has adequate resources to continue in operational existence and to meet its debt covenants for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statement.

2.5 Revenue

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the company and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured as the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes. The following criteria must also be met before revenue is recognised:

Rendering of services

Revenue from a contract to provide services is recognised in the period in which the services are provided in accordance with the stage of completion of the contract when all of the following conditions are satisfied:

- the amount of revenue can be measured reliably;
- it is probable that the company will receive the consideration due under the contract;
- the stage of completion of the contract at the end of the reporting period can be measured reliably; and
- the costs incurred and the costs to complete the contract can be measured reliably.

2.6 Borrowing costs

All borrowing costs are recognised in the statement of comprehensive income in the year in which they are incurred.

2.7 Valuation of investments

Investments in subsidiaries are measured at cost less accumulated impairment.

Investments in unlisted company shares, whose market value can be reliably determined, are remeasured to market value at each balance sheet date. Gains and losses on remeasurement are recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income for the period. Where market value cannot be reliably determined, such investments are stated at historic cost less impairment.

2.8 Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.9 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

2.10 Financial instruments

The company only enters into basic financial instrument transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade and other debtors and creditors, loans from banks and other third parties and loans to related parties.

2.11 Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.12 Interest income

Interest income is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income using the effective interest method.

2.13 Finance costs

Finance costs are charged to the statement of comprehensive income over the term of the debt using the effective interest method so that the amount charged is at a constant rate on the carrying amount. Issue costs are initially recognised as a reduction in the proceeds of the associated capital instrument.

3. Judgements in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In preparing these financial statements, the directors have had to make the following judgements:

Valuation of investments in subsidiary undertakings

The carrying value is regularly reviewed by reference to the net assets or liabilities of the subsidiary undertakings and current and expected future trading profits. If there is evidence of impairment the carrying value is reduced to its recoverable amount. The impairment loss is recognised immediately in the statement of comprehensive income.

Tax deductibility of interest

The company has entered into loan arrangements with related parties at a rate of interest disclosed in note 12. The directors have made an estimate as to the tax deductibility of the interest charged in order to calculate the corporation tax payable.

4. Auditor's remuneration

Costs associated with the audit of these financial statements and tax compliance services for the company are included within the accounts of Sygnature Discovery Limited, an indirect subsidiary.

Movements on other loans include interest charged at a rate of 10% of £3,099,085 (2020: £2,814,851) is which has been rolled up into the loans. These loans, which include cumulative rolled up interest of £9,646,463 (2020 - £6,547,378), are due to be fully repaid on 29 September 2027.

Bank loan

Movements on the bank loan include a further drawdown in the year of £9,700,000 and a repayment of £12,200,000 (2020: drawdown of £4,500,000; repayment of £4,200,000).
