1. **Accounting policies**

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015).

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods, excluding value added tax.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery
Fixtures and fittings
Motor vehicles

Stocks

Stocks comprise sugar confectionery products for resale and is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowances for obsolete and slow moving items. The cost of stock is determined with reference to the prices charged on the most recent invoices received, that is on a first in first out (FIFO) basis.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred by the balance sheet date with certain limited exceptions.

Deferred tax is calculated on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. A deferred tax asset of £104,224 (2014 - £63,693) at a rate of 20% (2014 - 20%) has not been recognised at the year end due to the relative uncertainty of its recoverability.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

Pension contributions relate to contributions made to personal pension schemes on behalf of the directors and senior employees.
